We just had a great raft up in Sunset Lake on Sunday. There were seven boats, thirteen people and lots of food.



Excerpts from the Boater's Alliance October Meeting

I. City Report

Mayor Matthews

- The City started repairing seawalls while awaiting FEMA formal approval. A letter is being sent to Congressman Steube and Senator Rubio requesting assistance in moving FEMA on the hurricane projects.
- The current City Manager has over the last three years enabled the city to meet and exceed the recommended 16.7% reserve. Punta Gorda's reserves are currently at approximately 25% emergency reserves, and excess reserves may be used for one time projects, including hurricane restorations.
- The Halloween celebration will return this year. Marion from Shreve to 41 will be closed and Retta will have one lane open, plus all cross streets in between Marion and Retta closed for safety for the trick or treaters.
- City's Comprehensive Plan is reviewed and updated every 7 years. The new Comprehensive Plan has been submitted to the state for review and upon approval will become effective. The updated Land Development Regulations (LDRs) that will also take effect at that time include:
 - ◊ Architectural requirements
 - ◊ Landscaping requirements
 - Setback restrictions
 - Or Parking requirements based on the building size
 - Height requirements including base flood elevation and maximum limits
 - bensity is restricted to 50 units per acre (reduced from the original 60 units per acre) in the City Center district

Having the LDRs in place means there will be no more exceptions or variances outside the established criteria.

• There is a joint meeting scheduled with the City and the County Commissioners November 21 at 1 p.m. at the Murdock Administration Center in Port Charlotte. Two items slated for discussion include day docks and parking at the event center. Attendees are welcome.

II. Police Report

Due to staffing shortages the marine officer is not currently full time on the water. There are 21 active marine volunteers. Two dedicated slips have been identified at Lashley Marina and lifts are to be installed for the designated boats.

III. Marine Advisory Report

MAC report given by John Welsh. Grant application forms should go out soon and need to be submitted in January for consideration.

- Discussions regarding Sunseekers request for permission to dredge a marina off their property does not appear to be possible currently.
- Boaters Alliance and the City of Punta Gorda currently have strong representation on the MAC. Each year the
 MAC distributes between one and two million dollars in the form of grants for marine related requests. If your
 organization has a marine related project, they can submit a grant request. Some grants require a 50/50 split. The
 requestor must provide 50% of the funds requested, however, the volunteer hours provided by the organization
 members can count toward to 50% requirements.


