For the Nautical Notes this month I wanted to remind everyone that Dennis Barkow performs Vessel Safety Checks for us, and everyone would be wise to have an inspection to make sure your vessel is safe to operate. Dennis's contact information is located below. This information is also located on the website under the Education Tab. Click on Safety Tab.

Vessel Safety Checks (VSCs)



VSCs are performed by United States Coast Guard Auxiliary and

America's Boating Club (USPS) certified inspectors. These volunteer inspectors are actively interested in helping to promote safe boating. The purpose of the inspection is to help ensure that your boat is safe and is compliant with current Federal and State boating regulations.

The inspection is free and typically takes 30 minutes to an hour depending on the size of the boat, whether it has been previously inspected, etc. If your boat is found deficient, the inspector will tell you what you need to do to correct the situation and return to re-inspect once you have corrected the problem. The results of the inspection are strictly between you and the inspector – the forms are not sent to anyone unless you choose to do so. At the conclusion of a successful inspection, you will receive a current year VSC sticker which you should attach to your boat in the same area as the boat State Registration Sticker.






