
Looking forward to a great Holiday Season to bring us all together for some laughs, great food, and a little dancing.

What is Emergency SOS?

 A life-saving feature using satellite linked to your smart phone that allows users to quickly contact emergency services and designated contacts in urgent situations.

Why is it Important?

• It provides rapid assistance in emergencies, even when cellular service is unavailable.






