
With the "under repair" status of marinas north, expect to see overnight cruises planned to the south.


There will be five private homes located in Punta Gorda on the tour, provided by the generosity of the homeowners. Harbor Home Builders is displaying their current model home as a rest and refresh stop, where there will be complimentary snacks and water available.

Several of the PGICA clubs volunteer to cover one of the houses in the tour each year. Mariners have been doing so since 2014, when former member, Cheryl Berlon, volunteered her home to be part of the tour. Over the years, other Mariner members have had their homes as part of the tour, as well.
