The Mariners Survey went out starting February 24. By March 24 we had 68 unduplicated responses back – a great response from members who care about what happens next for the club. I will

accept responses, and adjust the totals until April 15, but since we were already above a 50% response rate I went ahead with a preliminary presentation of results. About half the respondents have been in the club four to ten years, with the next biggest group having been members over ten years.

Cruising events seemed to be solidly supported. The difficulty in finding cruising grounds has made it difficult to provide for the 45 members who are interested in overnight cruising, but we will continue to try and post two to three cruises every month. We are hoping participation grows as we find new spots and hear your new ideas. Social events were popular, and most members seem to look forward to many or all of the events. People are being great sports about holding a Regatta right here in and around PGI. Happy hours are very well attended, and the Welcome Back Picnic and Commodores Gala were very popular. We have at least 28 snowbird members and those are events that land in the time they are in PGI.

Communication avenues found our website, Monday Eblast and Nautical Notes the most popular, followed closely by Facebook. We will continue to maintain these sites. Of course, "word of mouth" was also popular and we love that – wouldn't contain it even if we could.

After hearing the topic come up quite often, we were curious about attitudes toward our club requirements. This is a group of BOATERS and boat ownership and cruise/meeting requirements were solidly supported. A couple people asked us to consider "access to a boat" which might include Freedom boat club members – so we will look into that idea in the near future. Many said, "thanks for asking" and so many were very supportive of the 2025 Mariners. We on the board appreciate your enthusiasm and look forward to discussing items that might need addressing and proceeding with your suggestions.


Future cruises are in the works. Locations discussed for overnights have been Sanibel, Pink Shell and The Marina at Edison Ford. Stay tuned!




